



OKT-POTA Fest!

OKT-POTA FEST Field Report October 10-12, 2025 US-1352, Fort Washington State Park

Just as quickly as it began, here we find ourselves at the end of POTA-Mania Season.

The weekend of October 11th and 12th brought us cooler temperatures and unpredictable bouts of rain but that didn't stop us from getting out to the field to play radio. Despite the unpredictable weather, throughout the weekend we had a combined group of over 20 members and friends stop by the park to check out the operation and see what it was all about.

We had multiple operators complete activations on all 3 days with contacts totaling around 500 from the park! Some notable events of the weekend included a ton of great portable antenna installs, trying out a homebrew 40M coil that K0BUF made (great job on that, Chris), troubleshooting Microphone issues to assist KC3WHU make his first SSB POTA contacts and some POTA Elmering from WA3GM. We also had a visit from KC3BVL on Sunday who brought his portable VHF station by and activated the park entirely on 2m. I have included a photo of KC3BVL's portable VHF station for those who have not seen it before - as it is a very impressive setup to see out in a park! I also heard a rumor for next year that we may get to see a Parks on the Moon (EME POTA) activation.

Although the official club sanctioned POTA season has drawn to a close it's important to remember that these parks are around all year, and radio propagation doesn't stop just because we have reached cooler

temperatures. I for one plan to continue to be out at various parks throughout the rest of the fall and into the winter season, and I encourage you to do the same! Get out there and get on the Air, even if you have never tried it before you have nothing but experience to gain and enjoyment to be had.

If you managed to miss us during the club POTA season and want to give it a shot, but would maybe like some help for your first time, reach out to me and I will help you manage your first POTA Activation.

Thank you to the club for making these events possible, and thank you to all of our members for coming out to participate! We'll see you in the spring for Spring POTA Fest.

Here is the contest calendar report for November. It has less weekends with multiple contests than previous months. The 2nd CQWW contest and the ARRL Sweepstakes will be dominating the weekends. There are also a couple less intense operating events too.

November 1 - November 3

ARRL Sweepstakes Contest, CW - 2100Z Nov.1 - 0300Z Nov. 3. Unites States/Canada. 160, 80, 40, 20. 15 and 10 Meters. CW. Rules: https://www.arrl.org/sweepstakes. This contest will be lighting up the CW bands. This is the most complex exchange of any contest. If you want to improve your CW, this is the one.

Classic Exchange, Phone - 1400Z Nov. 2 - 0800Z Nov. 3, 1400Z Nov. 3 - 0800Z Nov. 4. Worldwide. 160, 80, 40, 20, 15, 10, 6 and 2 Meters. SSB, AM, FM. Rules: http://www.classicexchange.org/. This is an event to encourage and promote the use and restoration of vintage gear. You do not need a vintage rig to participate but lower points for modern gear. If you have an old boat anchor or want to hear what they sound like, check this one out.

November 8 - November 10

Worked All Europe DX Contest, RTTY - 0000z Nov.8 - 2359Z Nov. 9. Worldwide. 80, 40, 20, 15 and 10 Meters. RTTY only. Rules: https://www.darc.de/der-club/referate/conteste/wae-dx-contest/en/. Try operating some RTTY. This contest is considered one of hardest since it not only means working only EU DX but adds a QTC traffic component to the exchange.

10 - 10 International Fall Contest, Digital - 0001Z Nov. 8 - 2359Z Nov. 9. Worldwide. 10 Meters only. BPSK and RTTY modes only. Rules:https://www.ten-ten.org/qso-party -rules/. Another of the 10 - 10 contests to encourage activity on 10 Meters, which continues to be very good. You don't need to be a member to participate but collect ten 10 - 10 numbers and join up.

CQ-WE Contest - 1900Z Nov 8 - 0500Z Nov. 10 -see rules for mode/time breakdown. 160, 80, 40, 20, 15, 10, 6 and 2 Meters, 70 cm. CW, Phone, Digital. Rules:https://w8zpf.com/cqwe/. Work active and former employees of the Bell System/Western Electric Companies. Open to all but non Bell System hams only work Bell System.

November 15 - November 18

ARRL Sweepstakes Contest, SSB - 2100Z Nov. 15 - 0300Z Nov. 18. United States/Canada. 160, 80, 40, 20, 15 and 10 Meters. SSB. Rules:https://www.arrl.org/sweepstakes. Just like the CW version but in the phone bands. Same exchange but this time on phone. The bands will be busy with U.S. and Canadian stations trying for the "Clean Sweep", all 85 ARRL sections.

November 22 - November 23

North American SSB Sprint Contest - 0000Z - 0400Z Nov. 23. North America. 80, 40 and 20 Meters. SSB. Rules:https://ssbsprint.com/rules/. A short phone sprint with North America working everyone and DX working only NA.

November 29 - November 30

CQ Worldwide DX Contest, CW - 0000Z Nov. 29 to 2359Z Nov. 30. Worldwide. 160, 80, 40, 20, 15 and 10 Meters. CW. Rules:https://www.cqww.com/rules.htm. Like the CQWW SSB Contest last month, this is the big one but CW this time, Expect the CW bands to be hopping with lots of big signals and fast operators. Exchange only signal report (always 599) and CQ zone, 05 for us.

This completes November's activity. As always, you can reach out to me for assistance or advice in participating in a contest and logging.

THE PREZ SEZ

As the time approaches when the FCC will in all probability require that increased code proficiency be demonstrated in order to retain those privileges which we now hold as General Class operators, it becomes incumbent upon each of us to engage in a program on code practice sessions.

It seems to me that this need not be an individual effort, but can be assisted by our club. We now have the hardware to implement a code practice program on Channel 2. This hardware, however, is not yet connected. Let us set for ourselves a target date of December 31, 1965 for getting everything connected, and begin the year with a code practice program which can be an example for every radio club in the country.
