

Pricing and Reservations

PRICING: Lodging prices vary due to type of facility; number of guests the facility accommodates; Pennsylvania residency status; length of stay; day of the week; and season.

Please note, base pricing information does not include fees or taxes.

RESERVATIONS: Lodging in Pennsylvania state parks can be reserved 11 months to three days before the day of arrival. If it is two days or less before the arrival date, call the state park to inquire about availability.

For reservations, call the Pennsylvania State Parks Reservation Center at 888-PA-PARKS (888-727-2757), Monday through Saturday, 7:00 AM to 5:00 PM, or visit <http://pennsylvaniastateparks.reserveamerica.com>.

Reservations can be made using MasterCard, VISA, American Express, and Discover credit cards; personal, traveler's, and cashier's checks; or a Pennsylvania State Parks Gift Card. To receive a confirmed reservation, full payment must be received within ten days of making the reservation.

FEES: A non-refundable transaction fee is charged for each reservation.

Cabin, lodge, unique house, and inn prices incur additional state and/or county local tax(es). The county local hotel occupancy tax rate varies depending on the location in the Commonwealth.

Designated dog-friendly facilities charge an additional fee per night.

CANCELLATIONS AND CHANGES: Cancellations, changes, or transfers to reservations will be assessed a fee and can be made prior to arrival by the Pennsylvania State Parks Reservation Center.

Any cancellation, change, or transfer made upon arrival must be processed through the state park. For complete information on fees, cancellations, changes, transfers, and discount policies, view the Reservation Cancellation/Change Policy at the website in the "Reservations" section above.



Nockamixon State Park

The 5,286-acre Nockamixon State Park is in the rolling hills of scenic Bucks County, close enough to Philadelphia for a day trip, but far enough away for a vacation.

Tohickon Creek, Three Mile Run, and Haycock Run feed the 1,450-acre Lake Nockamixon, which is a rest stop for migrating waterfowl and a destination for boaters and anglers.

Visitors can stay the night in a cabin or enjoy the many activities of the park for the day. Popular activities are picnicking, swimming in the pool, hiking, biking, hunting, fishing, and boating.



Camp Nearby

Tenting and RV camping are prohibited at Nockamixon State Park, but stay at a local campground and enjoy the beautiful park during the day.

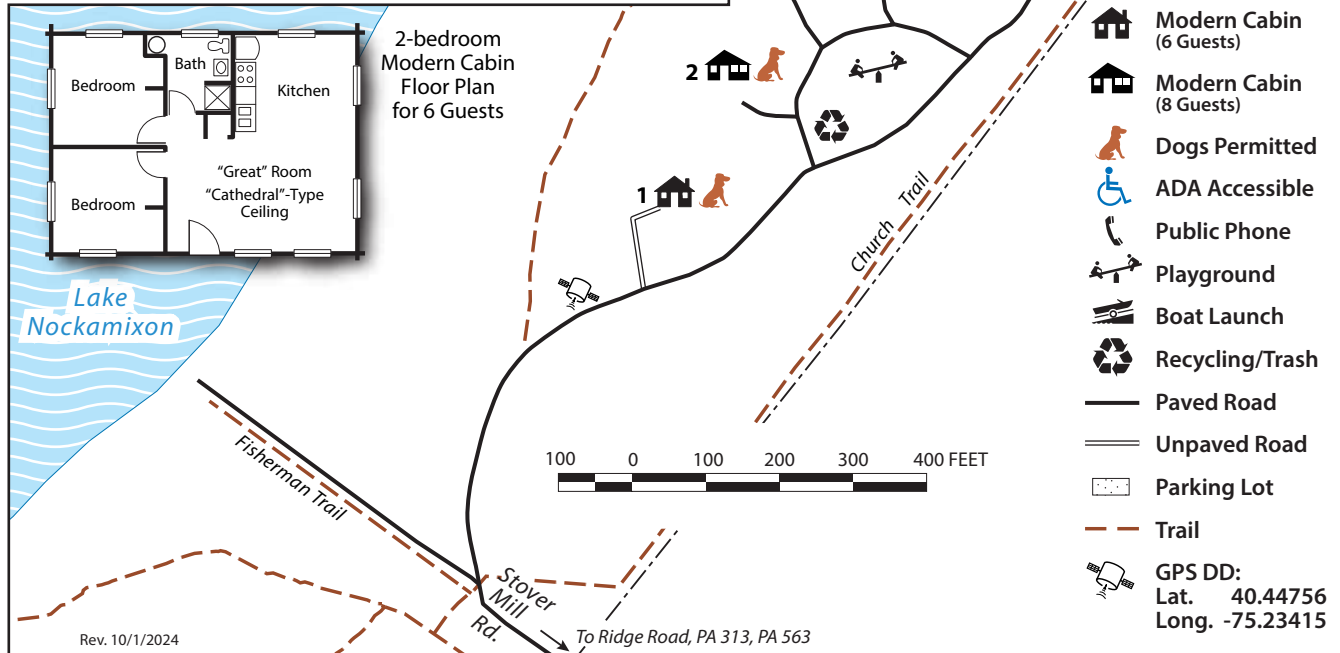
Modern Cabin Information and Map

Modern cabins take the rough out of "roughing it" for those who enjoy comfortable accommodations. Each modern cabin offers electric heat, bedrooms, living room, dining area, a modern bathroom, and kitchen with refrigerator, stove, and microwave. These beautifully designed log cabins feature a wooden cathedral ceiling in the main living area and modern conveniences throughout. There are two-bedroom (sleeps 6) and three-bedroom (sleeps 8) cabins available year round. Each cabin has one double-sized bed in the master bedroom and additional twin-sized bunk beds in separate bedrooms. Cabins 1, 2, 3, and 6 permit up to two dogs. Cabin 4 and 6 are ADA accessible with a ramped sidewalk to the door, roll in shower, and accessible, sinks, counters, and light switches.

Cabins do not have air conditioning or Wi-Fi, but cell phone service is usually good with most network providers.

WHAT TO BRING: All linens including sheets, blankets or sleeping bags, pillows, etc.; all cooking, serving, and eating utensils; toiletries; coffee pot; toaster; and fans.

Tents, camping trailers, RVs, and ATVs are prohibited.



Lodging Rules

CHECK-IN: Check-in time is 3:00 PM at the park office Monday to Friday. If arriving after hours or on a weekend, go directly to the rented facility. No early check-in.

CHECK-OUT: Lodging must be vacated by 10:00 AM. No late check-out. After cleaning the facility, disposing of trash, and removing personal property, place the cabin key on the table.

ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES: Alcoholic beverages are prohibited in all Pennsylvania state parks.

PETS: A maximum of two dogs are permitted in cabins 1, 2, 3, and 6 for a fee. Dogs must be under physical control at all times and are prohibited to be left unattended in cabins. Pets are prohibited in swimming areas, buildings, any area closed to pets, and all overnight facilities not participating in the pet program.

Guide dogs and service dogs are not considered pets.

FIRE: Fires are only permitted in fire rings, grills, and fireplaces. Fires must be attended at all times and extinguished before leaving the area.

Firewood is not provided. Cutting live or standing trees and the operation of chainsaws are prohibited.

QUIET HOURS: Campers must not disturb the sleep of others between 9:00 PM and 8:00 AM.

MINIMUM/MAXIMUM STAY: Modern cabins have a two-night minimum and a 14-night maximum stay in the non-peak season. In the summer peak season, the second Friday in June to the third Friday in August, rentals are weekly (Friday to Friday).

HUNTING: Use extreme caution with firearms at all times. Other visitors use the park during hunting seasons. Firearms and archery equipment used for hunting may be uncased and ready for use only in authorized hunting areas during hunting seasons. In areas not open to hunting or during non-hunting seasons, firearms and archery equipment shall be kept in the owner's vehicle or enclosed trailer. Exceptions include: law enforcement officers and individuals with a valid *Pennsylvania License to Carry Firearms* are authorized to carry a firearm concealed on their person while they are within a state park.
